A Right Respecting School at the heart of our community.

Our Curriculum

We follow a two-year cycle of whole school themes.

Each theme starts with a 'Super Start' immersion event to engage and stir curiosity amongst our learners. Children generate and contribute their own learning ideas for the theme.

We use 'Star groups' for focussed teaching. 'Missions' are tasks which promote all AoLEs and require our learners to apply skills taught independently.

We end our themes with a 'Fantastic Finish' event day to celebrate our learning as a school and provide a real-life context and purpose to the pupils learning.

The pupils choose the course they wish to enrol on. Each university group is made up of different aged pupils from Year 3-6. The course runs for 8-10 weeks. Children receive a certificate and keep a university passport to track the courses they have completed.

Learning Environment

At St. Alban's we have established a neutral, calm learning environment to reduce sensory overload and distraction for our pupils.

We strive to keep all learning resources clearly labelled and organised to enable our pupils to access them when appropriate and foster learner independence.

We have adopted flexible seating areas to support our learner's wellbeing and their learning. We have established different seating areas to increase comfort and physical support with the aim to increase engage and motivate learners and aid focus and collaborative learning.

Outdoor Learning

We have recently been able to invest in our outdoor provision and now provide stimulating playgrounds with a range of new features to promote physical development. Learners also access the outdoor area through PE lessons and sessions in our edible garden and Forest School area.

PROGRESSION

Learner progression along a continuum of learning from ages 3 to 16 is central to Curriculum for Wales. Using the What Matter Statements and Progression Steps we have mapped out progression across the school. We ensure our learners make progress moving along their own learning route at an appropriate pace and are supported and challenged accordingly.

•Increasing breadth and depth of knowledge •Deepening understanding of the ideas and disciplines within areas of learning and experience •Refinement and growing sophistication in the use and application of skills •Making connections and transferring learning into new contexts

We incorporate Assessment for learning across the school focussing on individual pupil progression, combined with teacher assessment. We use the statements of What Matters and progression steps to ensure all learners achieves.

Pupils learning is marked using Pink and Green highlighters, The Pink indicates where the children have achieved the learning intention. The Green identifies learning that can be corrected or improved. MAD time is used to provide time for the children to respond to the marking.



St. Alban's places a high importanc e on oral feedback to individuals and groups, during the lesson, with the aim to move the children's learning on and extend the pupils thinking.



Pupils at St. Albans engage in self and peer assessment opportunities. Providing them with a deeper understanding of their learning and next steps.

Parents are kept informed about their child's progress via parental consultations, access to the personalised test data and an annual report.
